## THE GOD IDEA

In the meetings that I attend on a regular basis the topic of God comes up quite often and that's not surprising since there is such an emphasis on trusting in some form of a higher power in order to stay sober. Alcoholics who continue to show up at the doors of A.A. all come from differing cultures and it is a blessing that the founders of A.A. formed the structure of the steps and traditions had the insight to insure that no alcoholic was left out, regardless of where they stood on this topic. The question of whom or what is God may never be answered to everyone's satisfaction lest A.A. could be turned into a religious organization and the Oxford Group proved that it doesn't work. In A.A. we have members from many different religions with different versions of what God means to their members. We have Buddhism which doesn't worship any form of a God. We have atheists that get sober in A.A. and do just fine as long as they have a conscience and live by good moral standards. On page 52 in the Big Book it says "When we saw others solve their problems by a simple reliance on the spirit of the universe, we had to stop doubting the power of God. Our ideas did not work. But the God idea did." When I first read this line it made me think. Is the Spirit of the universe God, or is God the spirit of the universe? Considering the fact I have never seen God in person (that I know of) it occurred to me that God resides in the Spiritual Realm. Most of my life troubles stem from my instincts gone astray and they are spiritual in nature. Fear, guilt, shame, dishonesty and above all, pride and selfishness all

## WHO'S YOUR SPONSOR?

There seem to be as many views on sponsorship as there are views on a Higher Power. And the opinions on these matters run a parallel range of extremes, from warm-and-fuzzy friend to wrathful tyrant. In meetings I have heard people recount with visible glee the fury and condemnation their sponsors hurl at them. "And then he said, 'You moron! You did that in the Third Step!'" Perhaps this model of sponsorship seeks to duplicate early childhood experiences at the hands of gruff-but-innocuous parents. Other people share stories of selfless sponsors with unparalleled devotion to their sponsees—helping to bury the dog's ashes; attending birthing classes.

My own sponsors have included one chronic relapser, a sponsor who refused to do anything other than read alternating paragraphs out of the Big Book, a sponsor who seemed most interested in giving me marital advice and a very wise old woman who would just smile knowingly when I would rant, rave and diagnose myself. My sponsees have included people who wanted to move into my garage on a long-term basis, one who fired me after the first session and another who seemed to use text messaging as a form of all-night entertainment. My best sponsees have been the ones who said things that made me think, Oh no, I'm worse off than that, and I'm supposed to be the sponsor! They are the ones who make me launch into action as soon as we hang up the phone or say goodbye.

One of the most rewarding moments of sponsorship is to hear a Fifth Step. There is no more profound a speech that a sponsee will ever make, nor a more essential audience that a sponsor will ever be. If there has been a thorough, well-guided Fourth Step, an attentive sponsor and a proper invocation to both persons' Higher Powers, the Fifth Step is a monumental catalyst for transformation. When I say that I am a grateful alcoholic, one of the pillars of that gratitude is the ability to transform my rocky past into stepping-stones for my sponsee's journey. It's like turning poison into medicine. That is why we don't regret the past or wish to shut the door on it. A sponsor has the privilege of using past experience to benefit others.

reside within my spiritual makeup. As the result, I cheat, steal and lie. As I progressed through the steps I was introduced to several prayers to help me to weather the storms that I faced as I took responsibility for my past failings and they helped me to get right with myself and the people I had harmed when I had no scruples. Things changed dramatically for me when I addressed step nine with the faith that I acquired in the program up to that point. When I reached step eleven the word "ONLY" threw me a curve ball. It tells me that I should ONLY pray for knowledge and strength. I read that to mean, God show me what to do and please give me the strength to do it. I don't know if anybody hears my prayers, but I hear my prayers and the right answers seem to come to me in time.

Well meaning people sometimes talk about praying for people to get well from a somewhat hopeless physical illness and I have to question the "ONLY" Clause in step eleven. The conclusion comes to me that if praying for that to happen and it worked, the hospitals would be full of sinners and the people we pray for would be healthy and happy. I don't see any evidence that God works at that level. When someone I know is in a grave condition I ask for guidance and it usually ends up with me being quietly realistic and giving as much support to the family members around that person. I have heard of miracles happening in some cases but I have seen just as many or more tragedies.

We take the best that religion has to offer; as we do with all respected philosophies and hopefully we become better human beings and deep down inside every human being is the fundamental idea of God. We all have a consciences and an EGO. As my friend once said, "you don't have to understand thermodynamics to enjoy the warmth of the sun". I say "don't let anything block you from the sunlight of the spirit". Rick R.

## A FIFTH OF AA.....It would be either a fifth of booze or

I ASKED Bill, the newcomer I'm sponsoring, "Is your Fourth Step written and pretty much completed?"

"I think so."

"Let's get together after tomorrow night's meeting."

"Okay."

I got to my own Step Five by telling myself that it would be either a fifth of booze or a Fifth of AA. The AA Fifth started me on a road to freedom I'd sought in the other kind of fifth and not found. With Step Five, I came into the spirit of AA. For me, holding back on Step Five was like my experiences at birthday parties when I was a kid. I didn't feel comfortable there; the group was intimidating somehow, and I felt I didn't belong. The other kids were laughing and having a grand time.

When someone's mother would encourage me to join in, I would plead, "I'm feeling a little sick."

As an adult, in AA, I chose the same pattern. "Come on, do your Steps." "Join in." " 'Easy Does It,' but do it!" I pleaded feeling sick: "I'm a recovering alcoholic. When I've recovered enough, I'll do the Steps."

Today, I choose to be, and work to go on being, a recovered alcoholic. This recovery must be maintained daily. The Twelfth Step directs me to share recovery. Sharing a Fifth Step is a vital part of my maintenance.

Tonight, I'll share a Fifth with Bill. We'll start with a way to help it flow, perhaps by my simply asking, "What do you consider to be the worst, most embarrassing thing in the inventory? The item you least want to mention. Let's get that out of the way first, and the rest will be easier." Then, I'll share something similar from my own inventory. The relief will be great. The tension will ease. We'll be on our way to cleaning house.

The prayer "Lord if I can't help, don't let me hurt" runs through my mind. I won't be there as a judge. This man will be sharing, with his Higher Power and with me, the things in his life he wants to keep and the things in his life he wants to throw away. I'll just be helping him take out the garbage. We'll both have some trash that we no longer want to keep--that we are ready to set out for hauling away.

I am going to feel an intense love and respect for this man. He will be talking about things he is ready to work on to make his life whole. He will be creating room in his life for the good things our Higher Power will give us when there is room for them.

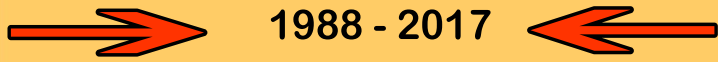
And I will gain new insight into myself. An area in which I was blind to myself will appear. There will be something to renew my dedication to AA--a new source of strength, a new place to work.
