This time of year does bring a lot of joy to many of us but it also brings distress to some of the less fortunate ones who haven't yet been blessed with the gift of sobriety and peace of mind, in and outside of A.A. During my drinking days I used to be very uncomfortable about the holidays. I never knew how to act around normal people unless I was half smashed. When invited to a celebration, I felt like a charity case and would rather just hang out at the bar where I felt safe. I never got into the spirit of reaching out to others. My family always celebrated the different holidays, and I always (due to My discomfort) would put a damper on it by complaining about the tacky gifts that people would buy for each other and the mad rush to go shopping and the commercializing facade that it had become. Any excuse was better than facing me and the miserable wretch I had become.

After being sober for several years it occurred to me that I still had some of those same attitudes, and that I was still holding on to them to some degree largely due to the inconvenience of it all. I explained this problem to a dear friend once, and he asked," Does the rest of the family enjoy the holidays?" I said yes. He then said, "Why don't you just take a back seat and just watch the joy in their eyes as they experience these things." I did exactly what he suggested and when I started to observe the childlike innocence and happiness it brought to them, it gave me a whole new appreciation for this time of year. It brought tears of Joy to my eyes and I no longer wanted to be the grouch, putting a damper on the joy that they were having. I have been following this line of thinking ever since and it has changed my whole attitude concerning these things.

This change of attitude has inspired me to apply the unselfish lessons that I've come to understand and now I spend the holiday season filled with Joy. If it works like that for the holidays, then why can't I bring it with me for the rest of the year? This has been my mission for several years, and I am always looking for the opportunity to brighten the lives of people less fortunate than myself. I try to do these things anonymously and without fanfare. I also try to consider the discomfort that I used to feel when I was the one on the receiving end of a charitable gesture. I am very careful to do these things in a way that preserves the dignity of that other person. I don't have to wait for the holidays to do these things. Every day is a holiday in and outside of my home, and you can believe me when I say; I reap more than my share of the joy. Rick R.

Someone wrote: "Self cannot rid self of self with self." This cliché proved doubtless true in respect to my obsession to hit the bottle over and again. No matter how hard or many times I tried to quit forever, I always ended up all soused up in some watering hole. After nearly thirty years of "quitting drinking forever," I luckily landed in AA. Also, fortunately, I was armed with indisputable evidence that self-will and self-knowledge would not work for an alcoholic such as me. I was helpless and hopeless after I took a shot of whiskey as well as before. Obviously, "Self" was of no avail, so when AA offered me a power greater than myself I grabbed it with near-boundless desperation! Terror led me to exclaim: I believe! I believe! Guess what? It worked! I did the steps and the obsession left me within the first year.

But what about so many of my drinking friends who simply quit drinking or learned to drink moderately on their own. The doctor told one of my friends, who drank worse than I did, that he had sugar diabetes and would soon die if he didn't quit. He did, and that was that! So, why couldn't I? Well, page twenty-one of the Big Book explains the nature of a "hard drinker" who can stop or moderate. My friend must have been one of those—he was a horse of a different color! His will-power and knowledge worked just fine and he didn't need a power greater than "self" to solve his drinking problem.

My 12 Step Relay experience

Roughly a year ago I was given the opportunity to cover the Miami-Dade Intergroup 12 Step Relay line. For those unfamiliar, this is a 24 hour phone service. Anyone seeking help with their drinking can call and someone will be there to answer the phone, 24 hours a day. I have the Monday night shift. On February 4th of this year I got a call from Daniel. He had just hit what would be

(his bottom and was willing to ask for help. Coincidentally (maybe not...) Daniel lives just a few blocks from me so we made plans to go to a meeting the next day. Shortly after that Daniel asked me to be his sponsor.

Shortly after that we worked the steps together. This past week, Daniel, now sober and having worked the steps, has picked up the Wednesday and Thursday 12 Step Relay service. He will be carrying the message of recovery to those in need, just as was done for him. To see AA work in people's lives and to see this program of service and (self-sacrifice come full circle in Daniel's life so quickly has been incredibly rewarding.
