#### Anonymity: The Spiritual Foundation We Failed Idealists Need Attention

I came from a family that was riddled with alcoholic drinkers and many of them had the problem as bad as I did. I recall the first month, or so, when I got sober, still hanging out with them at our favorite watering hole, drinking ginger ale. I would slip out every night at 8:00pm and go to the AA meeting at 8:30 pm and return at 10:30 pm without telling anyone where I was going. I didn't want anybody to know that I was checking out the AA program. I didn't want to face the ridicule at the time, and I wasn't sure it was going to work for me. If it didn't work, I wouldn't have put up with their mocking me. You might say that I was protecting my anonymity at the time and didn't even know it. After thirty days of that, I didn't care who knew about it because I believed I had found the answer, and I did. Soon after that I was one of those guys that wanted to shout it from the rooftops and try to sober up everyone around me and you know how that turned out.

As I dragged each or my five brothers to AA meetings, it seems that they each learned just enough to be able to rationalize exactly why they were not alcoholics, and they ridiculed me anyway. Since then, one brother, a nephew, and a niece have committed suicide. That was among the experiences that gave me hard earned lessons on the respect for the principle of anonymity. Of the rest of my immediate family of ten siblings, only one sister saw something in me that she liked, and she got sober in the program and hasn't had a drink in over forty-eight years. We are exposed to the discussions in AA meeting as the newer members complain about someone breaking their anonymity, or the ones that want to shout it from the rooftops, like my former self, and that will always be the case in AA as that is one of the symptoms of alcoholism. We are failed idealists that need attention, but as we get more experience, we learn the true value of the spirit of anonymity.

We can always come up with some noble reason for tooting our own horn and we can dress it up in the altruistic motive of sacrificing one's own anonymity to save someone's life and that, sometimes, in the long run, destroys the chance of being a good example and often turns out doing just the opposite, and I have personally witnessed that. In Tradition Twelve it talks

of Anonymity as" The spiritual foundation of all our Tradition ever reminding us to place principles before personalities". There is a difference in the" Spirit of the law", and the" Letter of the law". We who have been diligent with the program have been highly influenced by the Spirit of what the founders learned and introduced us to in the form of the 12 steps and the 12 traditions, and they all come in the form of unselfishness of the spirit. I have yet to find one prayer or principle in the two books that we use as reference guides, that are of a material nature or of selfish motives. This tells me that the things I do, that are as the result of practicing the principles of the program, should be done unselfishly and without fanfare. So long as I needed the attention that I was always seeking when I was looking for the photo opp., I was still only following the letter of the law, so to speak. When I came to understand the Spirit of Anonymity, I was able to rein in my EGO and my selfish motives. I try to be a good role model and do it quietly. It seems to work better that way.

# God,

I offer myself to Thee - To build with me and do with me as Thou wilt. Relieve me of the bondage of self, that I may better do Thy will. Take away my difficulties, that victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of Thy Power, Thy Love, and Thy Way of Life. May I do Thy Will always.

#### MY FAITH FLICKERED ON AND OFF

And then awareness came back in the joy of being alive and of seeing beauty again - The Search for Spiritual Experience.

WHEN I was very small, about six, I frequently had the idea that it might be disastrous if I fell asleep—I might stop breathing, and then I would surely die. Many years later, when groping for some concept of a higher power—something I could believe in, above and beyond the chaos of my own personal life—I experienced a new concept of God as an ever-present, intelligent, loving force that would keep me breathing all night, even though I let go, even though I never tried to use my own mind or muscle to save myself. My Creator, I decided, would sustain me. Understanding God was not necessary to save my life. Letting go, trusting Him, was necessary. This belief did not come to me without struggle. At the age of twenty, I had a serious case of diphtheria, and it nearly terminated my short life. Formerly healthy and happy for the most part, I under went heart and nerve damage which made me a semi-invalid for a couple of years. The man I was engaged to became discouraged and married another woman.

This incident (or catastrophe) made me cry out in despair to whatever gods there might be. Always a lover of natural beauty, I suddenly turned away from the God of bird-song, of starlight, of golden dawn. These messages of bright promise now mocked me. I saw myself sick, alone, deserted. Fate (or God, I thought) had mistreated me. What a good excuse for the heavy drinking that began later on! All this disappointment led to the inability to eat sanely or manage normal digestion, and thereby to ulcers.

The doctor and I worked on this problem for years. Only much later did I realize that no amount of trying or demanding or conniving could help my stomach. I couldn't turn my food into blood and muscle and bone. But there was an intelligent power within me which could—if I let it. During my drinking years, my faith in God flickered on and off in a pathetic fashion, and eventually the disease gained the upper hand and alcohol ruled supreme over my entire life. At my first AA meeting, I prayed for help, and my craving for alcohol was lifted from me like some horrible burden. A month later, while taking a walk, I stopped to gaze down at a huge ivy leaf, and tears came to my eyes. It was back—my conscious awareness of God, the joy of being alive, of seeing beauty again. God as the ever-present intelligence and love within people and animals and all the leaves on every tree-this is a joyous concept too big for me to explain or even grasp. But if we are patient and willing and live by AA principles, we do receive the gift of conscious contact, of awareness, and we can feel that Something Greater which keeps the stars in their orbits and peace in our hearts.
